Homeownership

A budgetary crunch is something we all face from time to time.



When it becomes difficult to make ends meet, sometimes we are faced with tough choices; pay this bill or that one. When it gets so tight that house payments lapse, home owners may get into trouble rather quickly if not dealt with early.



Here are just a few tips, if you happen to know someone in such a situation.

It is no secret when a person is facing foreclosure; the Village is notified by the County. In addition the Daily Legal News publishes foreclosures to creditors. lenders, communities, real estate offices, etc. The longer a homeowner is in the foreclosure situation, the worse it gets. Homeowners should seek intervention early.

HARP (Home Affordable Refinance Program) has been extended to help homeowners stay in their homes. Find out more http://www.harp.gov/

Loan Modifications, may affect the lender's credit on the short term but not have a long term effect. Contact your mortgage holder for options.



Short Sale protects the lender's credit rating to a point although it will show up on a credit report. It will not prevent the lender from buying in the future once finances are stabilized. Not so in a foreclosure which limits buying power both now and in the future.

Deed in leu of foreclosure is an option issued by the bank. Lenders must qualify for hardship with their mortgage holder.

Rent from your Bank. Many financial institutions will allow the lender to stay in the home and pay rent in order to keep the lender in their home.

Once in Foreclosure, the house may sit empty for years until everything is cleared.

Reduced Interest Loans for Home Repairs

Wanting to do some home eligible, as are all multirepairs this year?

Under H.E.L.P. the Housing Enhancement Loan Program, participating banks make home-improvement loans directly to property owners at three percentage points **below** market rate. There are no income guidelines.

Homeowners can use the maintenance, loans for remodeling, landscaping, or room additions. All homes valued at up to \$250,000 are family rental properties with more than three units. There are income nο restrictions.

H.E.L.P has made over 5,300 loans possible since 1992, totaling more than \$64 million. In a survey of borrowers, over 60 percent of respondents said they would not have made the investment in their property without H.E.L.P. These improvements have attracted new residents.

boosted property values, and stabilized the tax base and local school districts. Cities have even noted a "halo effect"—neighbors of H.E.L.P. loan recipients would not made home have improvements without county assistance.

The Ohio Department of Development (ODOD) offers several programs to help low-

income Ohioans pay their utility bills & improve the energy effi-



ciency of their homes.

Programs available:

HEAP Home Energy Assistance Program provides a one-time benefit annually to your primary heating source account.

SCP Summer Crisis Program provides a one-time benefit annually to your electric bill and/or purchase of fans & air conditioners.

WCP Winter Crisis Program provides a one-time benefit annually to your heating source account.

PIPP Plus Percentage of Income Payment Plan is an extended payment arrangement that requires regulated gas & electric companies to accept payments based on a percentage of the household income.

HWAP Home Winterization Assistance Program is a residential energy efficiency program that reduces the energy use of qualified households offering furnace tune ups. minor windows. doors & weather stripping

repair & insulation.



Empty containers must be **removed** from the tree lawn no later than **midnight** of the day of collection (Sect 981.03)

Rubbish takes place on Mondays except on New Years day, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day and Christmas Day.

Your Council Hard At Work

Some ordinances passed by Council so far this year are 2014-78 which updates and extends the Police Contract through 2017, ordinance 2015-02 allowed for a traffic study at the Forbes & Northfield Road corridors, 2015-03 is an application for a grant to reconstruct Macedonia Road, 2015-07 passed for a Village Hall renovation, 2015-11 authorized the Mayor to donate \$5,000 in support of a mentoring program managed through the Bedford Schools, 2015-15 gave the Police Dept. the ability to purchase two new police cars for

the regular rotation, then 2015-17 appropriated funds for the current year budget, 2015-18 secured road salt for the coming season which is too far away to think about but must be done this early to secure the best pricing possible, and 2015-21 authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with the County for the demolition grant.*
