Re: Richmond Road Resurfacing Project Columbus Road to Hawthorne East (Solon South Corporation Line)

Dear Resident,

Mayor Gary Gottschalk and Oakwood Village Council are pleased to inform you that the Richmond Road Resurfacing Project will begin on Monday, July 10, 2017, weather permitting. The project will consist of removing the existing asphalt pavement surface, performing any required pavement base repairs, and the installation of a new asphalt pavement surface. Four culverts beneath Richmond Road, located between Columbus Road and Solon Road will also be replaced prior to the start of the pavement reconstruction work. This project is a joint effort between the Village of Oakwood and the City of Solon. The project has been awarded to Ronyak Paving and the work will be substantially completed by September 12, 2017. Typical working hours will be 7:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday-Friday. Construction may occur on Saturdays and off hours as required to maintain the project schedule or to work within high traffic intersection areas.

Beginning on July 10, 2017 the section of Richmond Road between Columbus Road and Solon Road will be closed to through traffic for a period of 14 days in order to complete the culvert replacement work. Local access for residents and emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. All other traffic will be directed around the construction area per the attached detour plan. Please note, during this 14 day period your local access may change from day to day depending on which culvert is being replaced.

The asphalt pavement reconstruction work is scheduled to begin on July 26, 2017. Through traffic on Richmond Road will be maintained with flaggers during this phase of construction but delays should be expected.

The Village of Oakwood appreciates your patience and cooperation as this project is completed. You are urged to observe all traffic barricades, warning lights and flag personnel. These control devices and personnel are there for your protection and the safety of the workers. Above all, please caution children to keep a safe distance from all equipment and excavations. Construction equipment is fascinating to children, but can be very dangerous even while not in operation.
