- Cap out-of-pocket costs
- Get generic drugs on the market faster
- Let patients import drugs from Canada
- Tax the drug companies for price hikes
- Use foreign drug prices as indirect price controls

NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED THAT by the Village of Oakwood, County of Cuyahoga, and State of Ohio, that:

- **SECTION 1.** The Council and Mayor of the Village of Oakwood hereby urge Congress to require drug companies to make their prices more affordable.

- **SECTION 3.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.11 of the Ohio Revised Code.
