AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A COMMUNITY COST-SHARE AGREEMENT WITH THE NORTHEAST OHIO REGIONAL SEWER DISTRICT TO OBTAIN COST REIMBURSEMENTS FOR CERTAIN WORK TO BE PERFORMED IN THE VILLAGE ASSOCIATED WITH OEPA MS4 STORM WATER PERMIT REQUIREMENTS (2020 MS4 STORMWATER MANAGEMENT)

**WHEREAS**, the Oakwood Village Engineer has informed the Mayor that in 2020 it is necessary for work to be performed in the Village associated with OEPA MS4 storm water permit requirements (2020 MS4 Stormwater Management); and

**WHEREAS**, the 2020 MS4 Stormwater Management work includes the following activities: 1) Annual report preparation; 2) Development of Village Stormwater Management Plan; 3) Update Facilities Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWP3); 4) Review and update Village Ordinances; 5) Update Village Storm and Sanitary Sewer Map; 6); Inspect and Map Post Construction Stormwater Control Measures 7.) Address Illicit Discharge Requirements; 8.) Complete outfall sampling; 9.) Pay membership fees for Tinkers Creek Watershed Partnership; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Engineer and the Service Director have been informed by NEORS that the 2020 MS4 Stormwater Management work would effectively serve as a Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping BMP and thus qualify as a storm water management project eligible for Community Cost-Share Program funds; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Engineer and the Service Director were successful in their application to the NEORS for the disbursement of Community Cost-Share Program funds associated with OEPA MS4 storm water permit requirements (2020 MS4 Stormwater Management) work in the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) for such services.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the Village of Oakwood, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

**SECTION 1.** The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute a Community Cost-Share Agreement, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit 1, and any other documents with the NEORS as required for the disbursement of Community Cost-Share Program funds in the total amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) to provide services associated with OEPA MS4 storm water permit requirements work (2020 MS4 Stormwater Management) in the Village of Oakwood.

**SECTION 2:** This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village or Oakwood being that the foregoing repairs and upgrades are necessary to preserve the environment in the Village and to take advantage of funding opportunities to carry out said repairs and upgrades and therefore this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor provided it receives at least five affirmative votes of the members of Council; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
