WHEREAS, Myron accepted the Lord into his life at an early age and later reaffirmed his faith with his wife, Paggie; and

WHEREAS, Myron was quick to invite friends and family over for an evening of grilling accompanied by his favorite funk music and good company. In addition, building model cars was a favorite pastime as was bowling and watching science fiction television, such as Star Trek. He was an avid drag racing fan and was a frequent visitor to the Summit Motorsports Park in Norwalk. Ohio, but his favorite things to do were driving long hours as a truck driver and traveling with Paggie and his children. Florida was an annual destination where he made many memories with his family; and
