WHEREAS, Glover and Bernice joined Zion Chapel Missionary Baptist Church in 1971. The two put their faith in Christ and taught their children the same. They all grew in their faith as a family unit. Later, he served as a faithful Trustee; and

WHEREAS, he received an honorable discharge from the U.S. Marine Corp. He continued to enjoy track and field and competed in the 100-, 200-, and 400-meter dash, relays, hurdles and pentathlons. As a member of the Over the Hill Track Club, he competed in the triple jump, winning national championships in some of his events; and

WHEREAS, his hard work and dedication were recognized and rewarded as an employee of the United States Post Office on several occasions as well as from the Orange City Schools where he received an Employee of the Year award. Even after retirement, he continued to be active by working as a groundkeeper and caddy at the Canterbury Golf Club in Shaker Heights, Ohio as spending time outdoors brought him great joy; and

WHEREAS, years after moving to Ohio, Grover learned he had a son, Gregory, from a previous marriage who had also served in the Marine Corp and shared his passion for track and field. They had good times together at track meets in Cleveland and around the country; and
