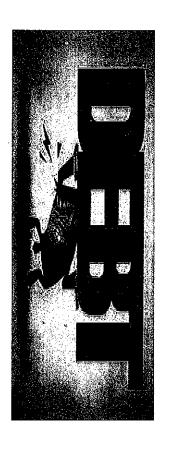

Dear Brian:

Please let this serve as a proposed budget for Law Department activities for 2023. The budget contains a \$3,000 increase for routine activities (approximate 4% increase) and a \$1,800 increase for litigation activities (approximate 17% increase) because it has been very difficult to perform all necessary duties within the previous yearly budgets. There is no increase in the hourly rate nor is there a requested increase for the Assistant Law Director/Prosecutor.

The proposed budget for the Law Director is as follows:

- 1) \$189 per hour capped at \$80,000 per year absent prior authorization of Council for attendance at meetings and other routine duties of the office;
- 2) \$189 per hour for plan reviews, re-zonings, variances, etc. with no stated cap;
- 3) \$189 per hour capped at \$12,000 per year without prior authorization of Council for litigation.

The foregoing items are not subject to PERS or other employer contributions.

The salary for the Prosecutor/Assistant Law Director for prosecutions and attendance at board and commission meetings in 2021 was \$51,000 per year and \$112.50 per hour for trial and appellate work capped at \$5,100 without prior authorization of Council and remains the same.

- 3) \$51,000 Asst. Law Dir./Prosecutor salary
- 4) \$7,140 Asst. Law Dir./Prosecutor PERS
- 5) \$ 1,224 Asst. Law Dir/Pros Medicare and FICA; and
- 6) \$5,100 Asst. Law Dir./Prosecutor charged at \$112.50 per hour for criminal jury trials, motion to suppress hearings and appeals (no PERS or employer contributions).

Total: \$156,464

Department Reports:

Fire-Tapp: Not much to report. We had a house fire on Christmas night. Minimal damage; no injuries. The next couple of days with the water temperatures being warmer, we had a lot of frozen pipes. We had 8 businesses with broken pipes so if any of the residents call you, we can come out and shut the water off to the house, but then it becomes a plumbing problem. We can help divert some of the water away. That's all we can do; we can't offer to help. **Hardin**: That is many house fires in 3 months. Can you put some kind of safety tips together? **Tapp**: I can have something to you next week.

Service-Haba: One of our service workers' panel box in his basement caught fire in his basement. His wife had called. They had a fire extinguisher there and she put it out. But they have been in a hotel ever since because there was a lot of smoke damage. Another fire I received a call from Mr. Callender and possibly Mrs. Gaither. Dispatch told me that two council people had called. I secured that door. It was the house that caught fire on Cambridge two doors down from Richmond Road. But I secured the door and the wood that was inside the door, it was too cold and I was too busy to go do it. This morning there was a crew there. I called the building department and asked Ms. Stoffl for the number of the construction crew that was there. She said she would call because she had a relationship with them. Their trailer was there, and it was broken into. All their tools were stolen. If it wasn't boarded up by late this afternoon, they were going to be there tomorrow and re-board up everything on that house. Gaither: I have gotten a couple of calls for driveways. Haba: There were a couple that weren't hit. Either they weren't on the list or.... Gaither: They should have been. Haba: Yeah, they all should have been hit. You can call me tomorrow and give me the names and I will check the list.

We mark them down every time we do them. Warren: And every year they have to ask. Haba: Yes, every year they have to sign up.

Building-Marinucci: To Councilperson Hardin, the last meeting you asked about the service of process. That has been perfected and the owner has contacted the building department. I know the initial discussions; he is going to pull the permit and I know that there are roof issues they were talking about. I had a conversation with the PD that we are not going to file the charges if he goes ahead and completes what we are asking him to do.

Finance-Thompson: No additional reporting.

Mayor: Nothing to report.

Public Comments:

Resident 1 Linda Moore-7229 Rayhham Dr: I just came to this meeting because I got the notice in my email. I really like having that to know when there are meetings. I want to ask about so much going on with this time, food shortages, power outages. I was wondering if we are allowed to raise chickens. Davis: The ordinance says you can have up to 4 chickens but no roosters. Mayor: For the Moores, let's give something so they know what to do. Give us a couple weeks and we'll have something in writing.... Warren: Maybe the Council Clerk to forward to her email address. Marinucci: Plans for a shad or somewhere to keep them. Warren: The Building Commissioner and the Council Clerk will get together to get you the ordinance and what you can do has far as housing, too. ORDINANCE NO. 2022-74 INTRODUCED BY MAYOR AND COUNCIL AS A WHOLE

- **SECTION 1**. Ordinance 2022-25, as amended, making appropriations for current expenses for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2022, be and the same is hereby further amended by making the following transfers and additional appropriations as depicted in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and expressly made a part hereof by reference, said additional appropriations emanating from additional revenues received in the General Fund for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2022.
- **SECTION 2**. All other provisions contained in Ordinance 2022-25, as previously amended and as further amended herein, which are not inconsistent with the provisions contained in this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- **SECTION 3.** The Finance Director be and is hereby authorized to make payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving prior invoices and vouchers therefore, approved by the persons authorized by law to approve the same.
- SECTION 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village, the reason for the emergency being that the same relates to the daily operation of a municipal department, therefore, provided it receives two-thirds (2/3%) of the vote of all members of Council elected thereto, said Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption by this Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

PURCHASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered as of the last date of execution specified below, by and between the Village of Oakwood, Ohio hereinafter referred to as SELLER, and Carlos Geraldo Rangel Gonzalez and Sandra Luz Mejia Alcantara, Husband and Wife, hereinafter referred to as PURCHASER.

- 1. SELLER agrees to sell, and PURCHASER agrees to purchase the following described real estate with appurtenances, located in the Village of Oakwood, County of Cuyahoga, and State of Ohio: One vacant parcel of property designated by the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer as Permanent Parcel No. 795-04-016 consisting of approximately .129 acres total, and Permanent Parcel No. 795-04-017 consisting of approximately .114 acres total (hereinafter the "Property"). The Property shall include the land, all appurtenant rights, privileges, and easements in their present condition "as is".
- 2. PURCHASER agrees to pay for said Property the sum of Three Thousand Six Hundred and Seventy-Three Dollars and 40/100 (\$3,673.40).
- 3. SELLER shall furnish a Warranty Deed conveying to PURCHASER, or nominee, a marketable title to the Property, with dower rights, if any, released, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances whatsoever, except: (a) restrictions of record and any reservations and easements created in conjunction with such restrictions that do not materially adversely affect the use or value of the property; (b) zoning ordinances, if any; (c) taxes and assessments, both general and special, not yet due and payable, for the current half of the taxable year and thereafter. The foregoing Deed shall contain the

following restrictions: 1) the property shall not be used for any purposes other than a single-family dwelling; 2) once consolidated, the property shall not be split absent the prior written consent of the Village of Oakwood.

- 4. The closing of the sale and SELLER's obligation to deliver title of the Property shall be subject to the following conditions:
 - a. Within ten (10) days of the execution of this Purchase Agreement, PURCHASER shall deliver the purchase price to the escrow agent.
 - b. Prior to closing, PURCHASER shall obtain approval for the following: The consolidation of the Property with the parcel designated by the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer as Permanent Parcel Nos. 795-06-036 presently owned by PURCHASER.
- 5. SELLER shall furnish a Title Guaranty in the amount of the purchase price, as evidence of assurance that there has been conveyed to PURCHASER, or nominee, the title required to be conveyed hereunder at PURCHASER'S cost. Should PURCHASER desire, he/she may obtain a Fee Policy of Title Insurance, so long as it pays the increased premium for same.
- 6. All general and special taxes, and all annual maintenance charges, if any, shall be prorated as of the date of filing the deed for record, based on the latest available tax duplicate, provided, however, that the full amount of all installments on any special assessments, whenever payable, shall be prorated and assumed by PURCHASER.
- 7. All documents and funds necessary to the completion of this transaction shall be placed in escrow with Ohio Real Title, 126 W. Streetsboro Rd., Suite 1, Hudson, Ohio 44246, on or before **March 1, 2023**, subject to their standard conditions of escrow

acceptance. If a defect in the title appears, SELLER shall have thirty (30) days after notice to remove said defect.

- 8. The Escrow Agent shall charge to SELLER and pay out of the purchase price the following: (a) amount due to discharge any lien encumbering the property and the cost of recording the cancellation thereof; (b) any amount due PURCHASER by reason of prorations; and (c) the amount of any special assessments payable by SELLER. SELLER shall also directly pay all utility charges to the date of filing the deed for record. PURCHASER shall pay the following: (a) any real estate transfer tax; (b) attorney fees incurred to prepare the Warranty Deed; (c) the escrow fee; (d) all fees and costs incident to filing the deed; (e) costs of any inspections requested by PURCHASER; (f) all escrow, and other fees associated with the closing; and (g) the premium cost for the Owner's Fee Title Insurance Policy, if desired.
- 9. SELLER shall deliver possession of the property to PURCHASER upon filing the deed of record.
- 10. The obligations of SELLER to consummate at the Closing of the transaction herein contemplated are subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) PURCHASER shall have performed all agreements on his part required to be performed under this Agreement and shall not be in default under any of the provisions of this Agreement; and
 - (b) PURCHASER shall have delivered the Purchase Price to the Escrow Agent as set forth in Paragraph 2 hereof.
- 11. SELLER agrees that PURCHASER shall be permitted access to the Property at all reasonable times to inspect same.
- 12. PURCHASER stipulates that there have been no express or implied representations, warranties or statements concerning the condition of said premises, the

value of same, the improvements thereon, the use that can be made of said premises, or

anything concerning same other than what is included in this written Purchase

Agreement.

13. Neither SELLER nor PURCHASER has retained any broker in connection with

this transaction, and each party hereto agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold the other

harmless against any claim or claims of any broker or any other representative for

commission, or finder's fee or expenses alleged by any third parties to be incurred by or

on behalf of the indemnifying party.

14. This Agreement shall not be assigned by either party hereto without the

express written consent of the other.

15. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the

laws of the State of Ohio.

16. Any notices provided for herein to SELLER or PURCHASER shall be in

writing and deemed to have been given when mailed, postage paid, by registered or
