Philosophy and Purpose Framework

Several best practice models were evaluated in the design of the 123 READ program. The evidence-based model that rose to the top was the SMART Model from Oregon, which combines volunteer support and educator expertise to best support student learning. 123 READ participants receive literacy support through large group instruction, small group reading and literacy games.

Program Structure

1. Large Group Instruction

Holistic curriculum designed by our very own educators.

- Focus on phonics, phonemic awareness, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension and writing

2. Small Group Instruction

Students will play literacy-focused games in small groups with their volunteers

- Focus on literacy through exploration and play

3. Small Group Reading Support

Students will select leveled books from our collection of Fountas and Pinnell readers

- Volunteer tutors provide one-on-one or small group reading support

4. Social Emotional Learning Circles

SEL Dialogues focused on recognizing, understanding and improving our choice making skills.
