ORDINANCE NO. 2024-04

INTRODUCED BY MAYOR AND COUNCIL AS A WHOLE

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF "ARGO", THE VILLAGE'S CURRENT POLICE DOG, TO GEAUGA COUNTY FOR USE IN THE GEAUGA COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT FOR THE SUM OF \$2,000 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, The Village of Oakwood owns a nine (9) year old German Shepard Dog known as K-9 Officer "Argo" whose canine handler (former Oakwood Police Sergeant Joshua Wendl) has resigned his position from the Village and is now employed by the Geauga County Sheriff's department as a Sheriff's Deputy; and

WHEREAS, K-9 Officer "Argo" at 9 years old, after serving the Village of Oakwood with distinction for these many years, is in the "late autumn" of his police dog career; and

WHEREAS, Geauga County has offered the Village of Oakwood the sum of \$2,000 for the purchase of "Argo" to serve out whatever time remains on his career as a K-9 officer under the continued supervision of his handler, former Oakwood Police Sergeant Joshua Wendl (a copy of the "K-9 Purchase Agreement" with Geauga County is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and its provisions are incorporated herein as if fully rewritten).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Oakwood, County of Cuyahoga, and State of Ohio that:

SECTION 1. The Mayor be and is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract on behalf of the Village of Oakwood with Geauga County, Ohio for the sale of K-9 Officer "Argo" to Geauga County for the sum of \$2,000, as more fully delineated in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully rewritten,

SECTION 2. The Director of Finance be and is hereby authorized to deposit the sale proceeds from the sale of K-9 Officer "Argo" to the appropriate account.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village, the reason for the emergency being that the same relates to the daily operation of a municipal department, and the need to authorize the transfer of K-9 Officer Argo to Geauga County and the Geauga County Sheriff's Department in a timely fashion so that K-9 Officer Argo can resume his law enforcement duties with his handler, Joshua Wendl; Therefore, provided it receives two-thirds (2/3) of the vote of all members of Council elected thereto, said Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption by this Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
